

HOPE Scholars Pick Up Increasing Share of College Costs

Students from low- or moderate-income families must clear ever-higher financial hurdles to complete a postsecondary program in Georgia. The HOPE Scholarship will cover 59 percent of tuition and mandatory fees at the Georgia Institute of Technology in the next school year and 62 percent at the University of Georgia. This is well below what it covered in 2011, when the HOPE Scholarship covered all tuition and mandatory fees and provided a book allowance at these schools and all others in the university system. HOPE will cover between 62 and 66 percent of tuition and mandatory fees next fall at most other schools in the university system.

The shrinking share of costs covered by the HOPE Scholarship makes paying for college harder for families across Georgia as many struggle financially. The median family income is still below pre-recession levels in Georgia, according to data from 2012, the most recent year available.

A growing number of low-income students in lower grades signals more high school graduates will need financial assistance to enroll in and complete a postsecondary program in the future. The number of low-income students in Georgia's K-12 schools is now about 62 percent, up from about 45 percent in 2002. These students and their families have limited financial resources to cover the gap in tuition and fees created by the diminished HOPE award.

If Georgia is to reach its goal to add 250,000 postsecondary graduates by 2020, it must ensure that students of all income levels can get adequate financial assistance.
