

## **HOPE Grants At-a-Glance**

For Technical Certificate or Diploma Programs

Where: Public technical colleges

Georgia's 2020 budget: \$66 million from the Georgia Lottery

Awards cap: 63 semester hours or 95 quarter hours

**Exclusions:** Students with bachelor's degrees are ineligible for HOPE grants. Students

in default on student loans are also ineligible.

HOPE Grant	Enroll in an eligible certificate or diploma program	Maintain 2.0 cumulative GPA	76% of tuition (\$76 per credit hour) in 2019-2020. No fee award.	32,311, or 54% of certificate/ diploma students
Zell Miller Grant	Earn 3.5 GPA during program (up to one term of retroactive award)	Maintain 3.5 cumulative GPA	100% of tuition (\$100 per credit hour) in 2019-2020. No fee award.	11,401, or 19% of certificate/ diploma students
HOPE Career Grant Students can receive HOPE Career Grant on top of a HOPE or Zell Miller Grant.	Enroll in one of 17 approved HOPE Career Grant programs, including practical nursing, welding	Maintain 2.0 cumulative GPA and enroll in approved program	Award ranges from \$125– \$500 per term, depending on enrolled hours. Commercial truck driving students get one-time \$1,000	15,929, or 27% of certificate/ diploma students

The HOPE GED Grant awards a \$500 one-time grant to students who earn a GED from a technical college and continue to any postsecondary program. About 996 students received the HOPE GED Grant in FY 2018.

For Associate or Bachelor's Degree Programs

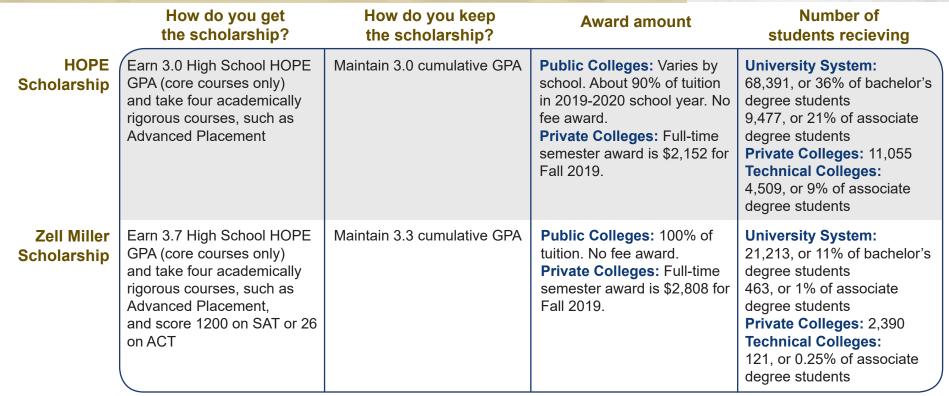
Where: Public and private colleges

Georgia's 2020 Budget: \$765 million from the Georgia Lottery

Awards cap: 127 semester hours or 190 quarter hours

**Exclusions:** Students are ineligible if more than 10 years after high school graduation, excluding military service; students in default on student loans are ineligible; scholarship does not cover

remedial courses
