Small businesses in Georgia



- 1.1 million small businesses (99.6% of all businesses) that employ 1.7 million Georgians—nearly half of the private sector workforce
- In 2019, very small businesses with fewer than 20 employees were the **biggest job creators**.
- More than 200,000 solo enterprises owned by people of color
- 500,000+ women-owned businesses; Georgia is ranked fifth in the nation for greatest number of women-owned businesses and second in the nation in growth of the number of women-owned firms



COVID-19's impact on small business



- 1 in 3 small business owners will not survive past the next three months.
 - An astounding 41% of Black and Latino-owned businesses won't make it through the next few months without additional financial support.
- 8 in 10 small business owners reporting that they are struggling to make commercial rent or mortgage payments—up 18% since late August.
- 64% of all small businesses and 73% of Black and Latino-owned businesses are concerned they will have to permanently lay off employees without immediate federal relief
